

ORDINANCE 25

An Ordinance providing for the establishment of an Auxiliary Police Force; To provide for rules and regulations for the operation of same; To provide procedures for appointment and dismissal therefrom; and, to prohibit impersonation of Auxiliary Police Officers.

THE VILLAGE OF NEWBERRY ORDAINS:

Section 25:1 Auxiliary Police:

That for the purpose of augmenting the personnel of the Newberry Police Department there is hereby created and established a reserve force of police officers to be known as the Auxiliary Police Force.

Section 25:2 Residents:

The Auxiliary Police Force shall be comprised of residents living in the Village of Newberry and the surrounding area and shall consist of such members as the Village President and the Chief of Police deem necessary, not to exceed ten (10) persons at any given time. The Auxiliary Police Force shall be under the direction and control and supervision of the Chief of Police of the Village of Newberry.

Section 25:3 Rules and Regulations:

The Police Committee and the Chief of Police shall promulgate rules and regulations, organizational structure, uniforms, duties, conduct, appointment and dismissal procedures, set standards of qualifications for appointment and training and any other rules or regulations deemed necessary for the efficient and respectful operation of the Force.

Section 25:4 Powers: Limited:

Auxiliary Police Officers shall have police powers only when acting under the direct orders of a full-time regular, sworn officer and during performance of a duly authorized tour of duty. At all other times they shall consider themselves a private citizen with no more powers than a private citizen.

Section 25:5 Exercise of Authority: Prohibited:

It shall be unlawful for any Auxiliary Police Officer to exercise his authority as a policeman or to wear the uniform or insignia or to display his badge in an attempt to exercise such authority except where the Village Council by its own action shall make provisions and appropriations therefore.

Section 25:6 No Compensation:

Auxiliary Police Officer shall serve without compensation, except where the Village Council by its own action shall make provisions and appropriations therefore.

Section 25:7 Worker's Compensation:

Auxiliary Police Officers, while acting under the direction of the Chief of Police and during regular assigned tours of duty, shall be entitled to all rights and benefits provided under the provisions of Act Ten (10) of the Public Acts of the First Extra Session of 1912 and the amendments thereto, known as the Workman's Compensation Law of Michigan, Council may provide any other insurance which they deem necessary for the welfare and protection of the members of the Auxiliary Force and Village of Newberry.

Section 25:8 Requirements:

Candidates for membership of the Auxiliary Police Force shall have attained a minimum age of eighteen (18) years and the maximum age, upon appointment shall not exceed fifty (50) years of age.

Section 25:9 Unlawful Use of Equipment:

It shall be unlawful for any person not duly appointed to wear, carry or display a badge, designated dress or insignia of such Officer.

Section 25:10 Penalty:

Any person violating Section 25:5 or 15:9 of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine not to exceed Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars or imprisonment in the County jail for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days or both, such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.


Section 25:11 Publication and Effective Date:

The clerk shall cause a copy of this Ordinance to be published in the Newberry News within 15 days and further shall make copies of this Ordinance available for public inspection at the Village Offices located in the NEWBERRY WATER & LIGHT BUILDING.


This Ordinance shall be effective twenty (20) days after adoption. (August 3, 1987).


